

ST. GEORGE'S HILL-FORTIFICATION

BUILT BY THE FRENCH DURING AN OCCUPATION FROM 1782-1784
THE FORT CONSISTED OF TWO SEPARATE GUN BATTERIES JOINED BY A TRENCH.

THE SMALLER BATTERY NAMED "REDOUTTE D'ARBAUD"
WAS LOCATED AT THE NORTH END, AND THE OTHER BATTERY NAMED
"REDOUTTE DE BOUILLE" WAS LOCATED HERE.

BOTH BATTERIES WERE PROTECTED BY STEEP SLOPES AND EARTHWORKS,
AND SURROUNDED BY DITCHES.

THE FORT WAS NEVER ATTACKED AND MONTSERRAT WAS RETURNED TO
GREAT BRITAIN IN JANUARY 1784 FOLLOWING THE SIGNING OF THE TREATY OF PARIS
ENDING THE WAR OF AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE.

ENVIRONMENTAL LEVY

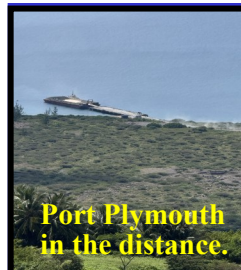
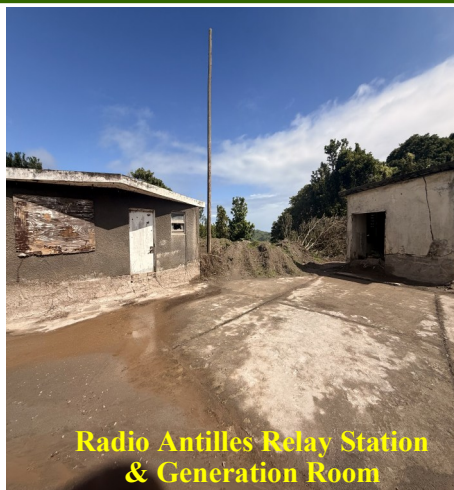
An environmental levy of XCD \$13 (USD \$5) per person is required for entry to St. George's Hill. This fee supports the upkeep, protection, and maintenance of this unique and environmentally sensitive area.

Residents of Montserrat and the Montserrat Diaspora may visit free of charge, but must still contact the Disaster Management Coordination Agency (DMCA) before touring St. George's Hill.

APPLICATION PROCESS

All non-resident visitors must contact a certified tour operator in Montserrat.

The operator will complete and submit the Tour Application Request Form on their behalf.

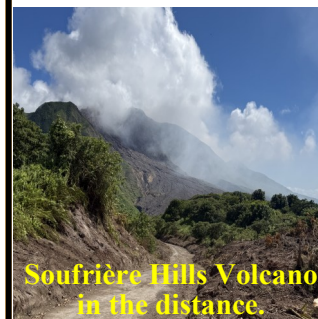


APPLICATION PROCESS

- Applications must be submitted at **least 24 hours** before the planned tour.
- For weekend or holiday tours, applications must be sent **by 2:00 p.m. Fridays**.

- The DMCA will notify the tour operator via email once the tour request has been **approved or denied**.
- All applicable fees must be paid at the **DMCA Office on Yellow Hill Road** prior to the tour.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR TOUR OPERATORS & TAXIS



- Vehicles must be **parked facing forward** at each stop.
- Radios must be **tuned to ZJB Radio**, informing the MVO of your location at each tour point.
- **Masks** must be carried for all visitors.
- Taxi and tour guides must maintain **strict control of guests**, ensuring they remain within designated safe zones.
- Visitors are advised to wear comfortable shoes, carry drinking water, and use eyewear to protect their eyes from dust during windy conditions.
- Depending on the wind direction, you may notice the **smell of sulfur dioxide from the Soufrière Hills Volcano**. If you have any respiratory conditions, it is advisable to wear a mask as a precaution. **There is no need for alarm—this is a normal occurrence in the area.**
